travelers, offering 4x Membership Rewards® points at U.S. supermarkets (on up to \$25,000 in purchases per year, then 1x) and at restaurants worldwide, and 3x points on flights booked directly with airlines or on amextravel.com. While it doesn't offer a specific bonus for ridesharing, the substantial rewards on dining can be very valuable if you frequently use Lyft to get to and from restaurants. The earned points can be redeemed for various statement credits and travel options.

Cashback Cards with Broad Bonus Categories

For those who prefer straightforward cashback over points and miles, several cards offer excellent rewards on everyday spending that can include ride-sharing or offer high cashback rates that can be applied to any expense.
