- Window Snip: Capture a specific active window.
- Full-screen Snip: Capture the entire display.

The editing capabilities within Snip & Sketch include a pen tool for freehand drawing, a highlighter, and an eraser. You can also crop the image and adjust basic settings. While effective for quick annotations, its editing suite is relatively basic compared to dedicated software.

Windows Key + Shift + S Shortcut

This keyboard shortcut directly invokes the Snip & Sketch functionality without needing to open the application first. It immediately presents the snipping toolbar, allowing you to choose your capture mode. After capturing, the snip is copied to the clipboard and a notification appears, which, when clicked, opens the image in the Snip & Sketch editor for further refinement.

Advanced Screen Capture Techniques in Windows
